Eureka! takes place mainly on the UMass Amherst campus for four weeks during the month of July, for five summers. Girls from Holyoke and the surrounding areas participate

The Holyoke Urban Bike School

HUBS is an after school program which uses bicycle mechanics and riding as a vehicle for youth development. Our programs are structured to instill confidence, leadership skills, and collaboration skills in our students. We aim to make cycling, from silly to serious, a viable option to members of the greater Holyoke Community.

- Earn-a-Bike: Students learn basic repair skills in this 20 hour introductory course. Each class covers a different mechanical system on a bike. Upon completing the course, the bike is theirs to keep. Open to students 11-16.
- bike Crew: Bike Crew is an advanced mechanics program open to graduates of Earna-Bike. Through their work time, participants can earn volunteer hours which can be traded in for parts and supplies. Participants refurbish bikes for sales, and are invited to participate in regular group rides.
- **Bike Shop:** HUBS is a full service bike shop. We offer labor and parts at affordable prices. Low cost bicycles of all styles are always available for sale, any time we are open!

Program: Bridging the Gap

Mission Statement: Bridging the Gap's mission is to educate youth on the resources and tools needed for them to make better decisions for themselves and ultimately attain a more promising future.



Bridging the Gap is a twelve week life skills program for at-risk and high-risk

youth ages 12-17 years old (18) in High School. Bridging the Gap works with the district attorney's office, probation departments, courts, police departments, the Department of Children and Families and local

schools. We take referrals from all these sources, as well as from parents and other agencies that work with youth. Youth attend the program after school for three days a week (two to three hours each session) depends on activity. Group discussion, brainstorming, videos, worksheets, and other creative activities are used to aid youth in understanding and benefiting from the lesson. In addition to the core life-skills education, the participants have an

opportunity to eat together and have some time to enjoy recreation and/or sports under the supervision of BTG staff. Personalized tutoring, art and music lessons and computer literacy are also offered. Guest speakers from the community are invited to share their expertise in the subject areas. Field trips include various colleg-

es, museums and outdoor recreation opportunities such as kayaking on the Charles and visiting the seashore.

*When program is completed youth will have a graduation and will receive a year free membership at the YMCA in Holyoke. Youth will also be able to participate in the Peer Leader program. 



Services MSPCC provides in the Greater Holyoke area include:

- Pregnancy & Parenting Support: MSPCC supports teen and young adult parents beginning at pregnancy. Home visitors offer encouragement and education to parents through each stage of pregnancy and early childhood development and offer guidance to parents in reaching educational and career goals.
- Child & Family Behavioral Health Services: MSPCC provides counseling for children and families in their homes, in schools, and in our Family Counseling Centers. Our clinicians work with children and adolescents with behavioral health needs through both one-on-one and family counseling.
- **Trauma Counselingg:** MSPCC clinicians help children who have experienced traumatic events like physical or sexual abuse, domestic violence, community violence, or the death of a loved one heal using highly effective treatments.






